As Review, Try and have your child recite Psalm 23:

“The Lord is my shepherd; I have all that I need. He lets me rest in green meadows; he leads me beside peaceful streams. He renews my strength. He guides me along right paths, bringing honor to his name. Even when I walk through the darkest valley. I will not be afraid, for you are close beside me. Your rod and your staff protect and comfort me. You prepare a feast for me in the presence of my enemies. You honor me by anointing my head with oil. My cup overflows with blessings. Surely your goodness and unfailing love will pursue me all the days of my life, and I will live in the house of the Lord forever.”

Ask:

- Have you enjoyed learning Psalm 23? What has been your favorite verse to learn about? Why?
- Why do you think it is so important for us to remember to view God as our “shepherd?”
- Do you know what verse 6 is trying to teach us?

Ask:

- Do you think it makes life and hard times easier if we can remember that someday we get to go to Heaven and live with Jesus?
- Do you know what you have to do be able to live with God in Heaven someday?

Prayer:

Take time to talk with your child/children about the concept of salvation and asking Jesus to forgive their sins. If this is something your child has already done, pray with them that they will stay connected to God and live for Him so that they will someday spend eternity in Heaven with Him. Pray for each member of your family.
